MOR currently serves as orthopaedic consultants to the Chicago Rush and as the team physicians for the Chicago Bulls and the 2005 World Series Champion Chicago White Sox.

The sports medicine group has pioneered and advanced numerous innovative treatments and procedures such as: complete arthroscopic rotator cuff and shoulder instability repair, knee (ACL) and ligament reconstruction, cartilage restoration, meniscal transplants, and arthroscopic and minimally invasive surgical approaches to repair damaged knees and shoulders, as well as total shoulder replacement. These types of innovative approaches yield excellent outcomes and minimize tissue trauma, allowing for accelerated rehabilitation and a faster return to work or sport.

MOR is also proud to be the home of a women's sports medicine program, providing a comprehensive approach to evaluating and treating recreational and competitive fe-

male athletes. This program provides team physician services to the Chicago Bandits, the U.S. Women's Soccer Team, and to numerous professional dance companies in the Chicago area.

MOR is a highly subspecialized orthopaedic group practice of over 30 physicians, primarily based at Rush University Medical Center, Central DuPage Hospital, and Rush Oak Park Hospital. Each physician focuses on one of the following specialties: foot and ankle; joint reconstruction; orthopaedic oncology; physical medicine/pain management; spine, back, and neck; sports medicine/athletic injuries; trauma; and upper extremity: shoulder, elbow, wrist, and hand.

The physicians of MOR are board certified and fellowship-trained in their subspecialty; hold academic appointments at Rush Medical College; are on staff at Rush University Medical Center; and are active in patient education and research.
